President's Report

WELCOME ALUMNI BAND

Fellow Longhorn Alumni Band members, welcome back to the 40 Acres, as we reprise our fondest memories of school and Longhorn Band. We are celebrating our 60th Band Day as we prepare to leave the Big 12 and join the SEC. As always, this will be an exciting weekend and has been a memorable year.

Your LHAB Officer team has been busy working to make this the best Band Day ever so we may enjoy our time together reminiscing, meeting new friends, welcoming new members, and sharing an incredible half time performance with LHB. Our leadership team has worked diligently throughout the year on several initiatives improving LHAB member services and supporting Longhorn Band.

Our initiatives during the year included:

- 1. **Publishing monthly Blasts** apprising our members of LHAB events, and keeping you abreast of other memorable LHAB activities. Thank you to the communications team for continually providing pertinent information to our membership.
- 2. Soliciting assistance with collecting LHB memories. UT is planning a major fundraising campaign for LHB. Part of their efforts include stories about our experiences that may stir other individuals, including non-LHB members, to make donations supporting LHB and LHB scholarships. Thank you to the individuals that have already provided stories. We can always use more. If you'd like to share a story, please email <u>lhabcharitablefund@gmail.com</u>.

- 3. **Performing at playing events across Texas** with stops in San Antonio, Fort Worth, Dallas, Houston, and Austin including: Brenham MaiFest, Texas Fight Tour, Denton County Texas Exes, Fairmont Conference, Jim Schwobel Wake, Comal Texas Exes Student Send Off, Gambler Rodeo, and the Neighborhood Longhorns Program Dinner. Austin-area members continue performances each Friday at the UT Club before each home football game. Thank you to all the individuals that performed at the various events, and the Area Representatives for gathering individuals for the performances.
- 4. **Distributing beanies to new LHB members** in 2022 on 12/1/22. We're working to distribute the beanies much earlier in 2023 and have already delivered 200 beanies to LHB to prepare for distribution in 2023. Thank you to the individuals that helped distribute beanies to new LHB members.
- Representing LHAB to the National Association of Alumni Bands (NAoAB) on two (2) calls. First on 12/7/22 to recap our Big Bertha Centennial celebration. Then again on 2/1/23 to discuss funding and how LHAB is organized with Officers, Board of Directors, Board of Trustees, and Committees.
- 6. **Creating a committee to address LHAB volunteer needs.** The committee evaluated several possible software packages that could support both Band Day requirements along with other events throughout the year. The committee selected the software package SignUpGenius. SignUpGenius also happens to be the package used by LHB. This provides the opportunity for LHB to volunteer for Band Day and grow accustomed to the software package before

joining LHAB. Thank you to all the individuals that served on the software selection committee.

- 7. **Convening an LHAB Uniform Committee** to review the current LHAB uniform and propose a solution for the foreseeable future. The committee spent several months defining LHAB's uniform objectives, contacting other alumni bands, and surveying LHAB dues-paying members for possible solutions and preferences. The committee recommended we upgrade our vests to include the LHAB logo, the uniform LHAB is enjoying from this year's Band Day onwards. Our LHAB officers and LHAB Board of Directors each approved the committee's recommendation. Thank you to all the individuals that served on the uniform committee, along with all our membership who responded to the uniform survey.
- 8. **Continuing the LHAB Bylaws Review Committee** to recommend updates to the current LHAB Bylaws and LHAB Handbook. The Bylaws Review Committee spent several months reviewing and considering every detail of our current Bylaws and Handbook. Many recommendations as approved by our officers and Board of Directors have already been incorporated into the LHAB Handbook. Additional recommendations for updates to the LHAB Bylaws may be incorporated at a future date. Thank you to all the individuals that served on the Bylaws Review Committee.
- 9. Calling upon the Code of Ethics Committee to refresh our LHAB Code of Conduct and provide a solution allowing immediate action to be taken in the event of a violation to our Code of Conduct. The committee updates were approved by Dr. Croomes,

the LHAB officers, and the LHAB Board of Directors, and applied to the LHAB Handbook. We each were able to review the updates when we registered for Band Day 2023 and agreed to adhere to them before registering. Thank you to the Code of Ethics Committee and all the individuals that assisted in their implementation.

- 10. **Consolidating all LHAB properties into a single Austin location** on 2/18/23. Instruments were removed from the Band Hall and placed in LHAB storage. Additionally, all properties were moved from the UHaul storage space into the same single LHAB storage location. Thank you to all the individuals that helped with the move. It truly took a community to support/conduct this consolidation.
- 11. **Hosting the 3rd Annual LHAB Golf Classic on 3/6/23.** The event was held at the University of Texas Golf Club, with 16-four (4) member teams enjoying the morning, and the opportunity to raise funds for LHB scholarships. Thank you to all the individuals that planned the golf classic and those who played in the tournament.
- 12. **Inducting Big Bertha into The Frank Denius Family University of Texas Athletics Hall of Fame on 4/5/23.** Big Bertha is now officially installed in her permanent residence in the UT Hall of Fame in the North End Zone of Darrell K. Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium. Please stop by and have your picture taken with Big Bertha. She'll enjoy the notoriety.
- 13. Enjoying time with LHB at their annual spring banquet on 4/25/23. LHAB was able to share time with current students distributing key chains and

helping non-returning individuals register as members of LHAB. We also provided white-collared shirts so they are prepared for their first Band Day as a member of LHAB. Thank you to all the individuals able to attend the banquet and assist LHB with their joining our LHAB ranks.

14. Conducting another instrument sale on

4/29/23. We were able to distribute all unneeded instruments except a few remaining mellophones and generate revenue to support LHAB endeavors. Thank you to all the individuals that coordinated the instrument sale and the individuals purchasing the instruments generating additional funds to support LHB/LHAB activities.

- 15. Attending the annual College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA) and National Association of Alumni Bands (NAoAB) Symposium May 31 through June 3, 2023 in Cincinnati, Ohio. Both Geof Sloan and Shirley Cumby represented LHAB with honor and distinction. Geof currently serves as the NAoAB President. Any LHAB member may participate in the free virtual networking events. - 16. **Promoting participation in the LHB Summer Band from June 19-21, 2023.** The rehearsals provided a chance to get the mouth back in shape for Band Day and present a stirring and memorable concert. Thank you to all the individuals that shared their time and talents in the summer band.
- 17. Strengthening our LHB ties by placing their old Stetsons at LHAB storage on 8/13/23.Almost 400 Stetsons are being stored until the next

phase of the Stetsons journey is determined. Thank you to all the individuals that helped with the move and storage of the LHB Stetsons.

- 18. Preparing 1000 hot dogs and feeding prospective LHB individuals, current LHB members, LHB Directors and Office staff on 8/14/23. Everyone had a great time and ate their fill of hot dogs. Thank you to all the individuals that prepared the hot dogs and served LHB and prospective LHB individuals.
- 19. **Distributing the annual LHB gift on 8/28/23.** Dr. Croomes requested 420 Port Authority Upright Crossbody Bags marked with a burnt orange "LHB" as the students would need and appreciate them. The students were in fact thrilled to receive our gift.
- 20. **Creating a new endowed scholarship focused on financial need.** Through donations over the past few years, a new endowed scholarship has been created. - 21. Helping UT advance a new fundraising program to recognize planned giving with the Script Texas Society. You'll hear more over Band Day weekend about this exciting program to honor those who commit to a legacy gift that supports LHB. Unlike other ways of giving, no immediate donation is required, but rather supporters pledge a portion of their estate as a gift to support LHB. will make an immediate financial award to LHB to thank you, and those presidential funds can be used to support current LHB needs, such as instruments, scholarships, or operational costs. Working with the LHAB Board of Trustees and UT Development to create an entire array of outreach programs to increase financial support for LHB, including the Script Texas Society, surveys to learn more about LHAB members' interest in different ways of supporting LHB, new annual fund programs to support current LHB operations, new outreach to solicit support from the entire UT community, and the President's Office making LHB funding a "University Priority." These powerful initiatives will help guarantee that LHB will enter the SEC next year as the finest and best-supported marching band in the nation.
- 23. **Opening and updating the LHAB online merchandise store.** LHAB officers continue to work toward offering more items through our online store. UniquePrints operates the store and makes donations to LHABCF supporting LHB scholarships. Thank you UniquePrints for supporting LHB and LHAB.

- 24. Convening a Membership Perk Review Committee. The committee polled our LHAB membership for input regarding the annual perks provided and whether they planned on renewing their membership at the same level. The committee recommended adjustments to our perks for 2023-2024 which were approved by the LHAB Officers and LHAB Board of Directors. The approved membership perks were presented to our membership prior to the recurring dues being collected. This was the first year that dues were collected automatically aligned with the LHAB fiscal year. Thank you to all the individuals that served on the Membership Perk Review Committee. Thank you also to all our members who continue supporting LHB and LHAB through renewing your dues. These funds truly make a difference in the lives of LHB students and what LHAB provides them.
- 25. **Planning and preparing for Band Day 2023.** Changes have been made to support a more expeditious rehearsal. With the rehearsal flowing smoothly we'll be able to enjoy barbecue for our Band Day meal rather than breakfast tacos. Regardless of kick-off time, even 11:00 a.m., we'll enjoy Black's BBQ. Thank you to all the individuals that spent so much of their time and talents making Band Day 2023 the best Band Day ever.
- 26. Blasting the Leadership Application to 4,000+ LHAB members soliciting volunteers and nominations for the 2023-2024 LHAB Leadership Team. Once again, the generosity and Longhorn spirit of the "Blast From the Past" resonates throughout the LHB family in the form of student scholarship support. These scholarships are paid from endowments funded almost entirely through gifts from LHB alumni, and your efforts continue to demonstrate the solid support LHAB and its members provide for the Longhorn Band and its students.

Your voice *matters*, and if you have a background in communications, writing, marketing, fund-raising, or digital marketing, we really need your help. Founding Members Of The Longhorn Alumni Band

In January 1964, James and Patsy Hejl (LHB 1958-1961) were approached by Jane and Vince DiNino to start an alumni band similar to the alumni band at The University of Minnesota. After some discussion, James and Patsy got to work making lists of LHB members using their copies of the Cactus Yearbook and the Austin phone book, placing names on 3x5 index cards on their kitchen table. It did not take long to realize they needed help, so three other former Longhorn Band couples were recruited. They quickly had a list of 500 names of former Longhorn Band members who became the first to call themselves the Blast from the Past. Their first reunion back in Austin to celebrate their LHB family bond was in 1964 with 67 members attending.

History Of The President's Gavel

These words are taken from the plaque on the gavel case:

Completely hand-turned from pine blocks salvaged from the barracks building which stood at 500 East 23rd Street and served as the "temporary" home of the Longhorn Band from 1947-1969.

The President's Gavel is given annually to the incoming President.

Presented to President Garland Hagood at the 7th Annual Meeting at the Villa Capri Club Caravan Oct. 3, 1970 (Texas 20 - UCLA 17)

History Of The H.B. Dunagan, Jr. Scholarship Hat

H.B. Dunagan was LHAB President from 1966-67. Being of the old school and because his hair was a little thin on top, he always wore a hat. Members of the Alumni Band first made the effort to collect funds for scholarships at our 2nd annual meeting as a way to give something back to the great organization that first brought us together. H.B. modestly offered his hat to be passed around to collect scholarship money, and each year thereafter he repeated the gesture. H.B. passed away in 1974 and his widow, Lucy, gave the hat he wore during his year as president to the LHAB so that we could continue this worthy tradition. Donna Beth McCormick, a dear friend of H.B. and Lucy, added the needlepoint "Band" as a highlight to the hat and remains its caretaker to this day. While other practical containers are passed around now, the hat remains a treasured symbol of the willingness to volunteer and support the Longhorn Band. Scholarships are a strong foundation of the LHAB, so help us keep the tradition alive by giving what you can when the "hat" comes by.

Longhorn Band President's Ring Irwin Curtis Popham Drum Major, 1939-1943 LHB President, 1942-1943

Following his graduation from Austin High School, Curtis Popham entered The University in 1939 to pursue a BBA degree. In addition to his Longhorn Band activities, Curtis was an outstanding student and involved in many other campus organizations: Cowboys, Chi Phi, Kappa Kappa Psi, Varsity Basketball, Friars, Rogues and Who's Who. During World War II, Lieutenant Curtis Popham was a B-17 pilot in the Army Air Corps. Curtis, and his crew, were killed on his 22nd birthday, January 13, 1945, when his loaded plane exploded over Germany after being hit by heavy ground fire. Remembering his exuberance and love for the Longhorn Band, Curtis' parents presented his class ring to the Band to be worn by future Presidents. The ring represents a valued link between Longhorn Bands of many eras, each with its own distinctive images, memories and traditions, and each contributing to a continuing legacy of excellence. Symbolic of this unbroken link with previous eras, the ring passes from President to President. The ring that is presented now is a replica of the original ring that had become very worn over time. The replica, presented at Alumni Band Day on October 4, 1996, can be worn on a daily basis by the Band President.

Brass Plaque Inscription

Manufactured by Leedy & Ludwig Drum Division of C. G. Conn Music Company for the University of Chicago delivered October, 1922; shell sized to fit drum heads made from largest steers available at Chicago Stock Yards. Purchased for The University at the suggestion of General D. Harold Byrd, longtime benefactor of the Longhorn Band and The University. Acquired in December 1954 for \$1.00 and transported from Elkhardt, Indiana to Austin, Texas by Longhorn Band Director Moton H. Crockett, Jr. Refurbished spring & summer of 1955 by M. H. Crockett; presented to incoming Longhorn Band Director, Vincent R. DiNino.

The History of Big Bertha

Date of Birth – October, 1922 in Elkhart, Indiana Adopted by the Longhorn Band – August, 1955 in Austin, Texas Reborn – August, 2007 in Austin, Texas

Overseas Travel – January 1, 2015 to London, England Retired – October 15, 2022 in Austin, Texas

During the spring and summer of 2007, Bertha traveled to the Remo Drum Company in Valencia, California for a complete overhaul. Her shell was stripped and damaged wood was replaced. She was completely cleaned and repainted. New heads, new aluminum counter hoops, new lettering (actually a decal), and re-plated hardware. While she was in California, her carriage was redone here in Austin. The carriage was cleaned, old welds were redone, tie-down loops attached, new mounting brackets fabricated, and the entire carriage was powder coated white with burnt orange spoke wheels. New tires and balance wheels were installed. The carriage was ready when Bertha arrived back in Austin on August 17, 2007 but the new mounting brackets had to be slightly modified. On August 24, 2007 a group of KKY pledges led by President Eddie Lopez along with Moton Crockett, J. P. Kirksey, George Moxley, and David Jones met

at the Band Hall and successfully attached Bertha to her carriage and she was ready for her debut on September 1, 2007.

On New Year's Day 2015, Bertha attended her first overseas event as she lead in the London's New Year's Day Parade with the Longhorn Alumni Band, which was capped off by a performance under the historic Big Ben clock tower and thousands of adoring Great Britain and European fans ringing in the new year of 2015. Under the watchful eye of her crew, Big Bertha continues to stay fashionable with her receipt of a new set of drum heads designed by Longhorn Band Senior Administrative Associate Alexandra Gotilboski and provided by the Remo Drum Company debuting at the first home football game in 2016.

On October 15, 2022 Big Bertha was officially retired after 100 years of service during the halftime show of Alumni Band Day Weekend. She is proudly on display in The Frank Denius Family University of Texas Athletics Hall of Fame located in the North end zone of Darrell K. Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium.
